India-Korea Smart City Partnership: MMRDA enhances relationship to fast-track Mumbai 3.0 Vision

India and South Korea have partnered to develop smart city initiatives in Mumbai under the MMRDA's "Mumbai 3.0" vision. This collaboration aims to integrate Korean technology and expertise in urban planning, mobility, and sustainability to transform Mumbai's infrastructure, improve quality of life, and foster economic and technological cooperation. South Korea and Taiwan are joining Japan in supporting India's semiconductor ambitions, aiming to reduce dependence on China and strengthen supply chains. Low birth rate's far-reaching impact: Sustainability of teacher pensions under threat

South Korea's demographic crisis is straining the Teachers' Pension system, with early retirements rising due to school closures. Over 400 educators, including some in their 30s, began drawing pensions early. With declining student numbers and no reforms, the fund faces a deficit by 2028 and potential depletion by 2042. South Korea uncovers rise in Chinese goods relabeled for US tariff evasion


South Korea's customs agency reported 29.5 billion won in violations in the first quarter, mostly from China, attempting to bypass US tariffs under President Trump. Products like cathode materials and surveillance cameras were falsely labeled as South Korean exports. A special task force has been formed to prevent further violations, and US officials are cooperating on investigations. *Read more*

South Korea, China set for maritime talks amid tensions over steel structures in West Sea

South Korea and China are set to hold maritime talks to address tensions over the construction of steel structures in the Yellow Sea. The structures, which South Korea claims are for research purposes, have sparked concerns in China about potential disruptions to its fishing activities. Both sides aim to resolve the issue diplomatically. <u>Read more</u>

South Korea April 1-20 exports fall as US shipments drop amid tariffs

South Korea's exports rose 11.1% year-on-year from April 1–20, driven by strong semiconductor and ship sales. Semiconductor exports surged 43.4%, highlighting recovery in the tech sector. Imports also grew by 5.6%, indicating resilient domestic demand. The trade balance remained positive, reflecting steady economic momentum despite global uncertainties. *Read more*



Seoul and Washington Launch High-Level Economic Talks, Aim for July Trade Deal

South Korea and the U.S. kicked off their first "2+2" economic talks in Washington on April 24, seeking to avoid renewed tariffs and deepen cooperation in trade, investment, and economic security. The two sides agreed to pursue a "July Package" before the mutual tariff waiver expires on July 8. *Read more*

North Korea Confirms Troop Deployment to Russia

North Korea officially confirmed sending troops to Russia, citing a strategic treaty with Moscow. Pyongyang's forces fought in Russia's Kursk region under Kim Jong-un's orders. This follows Kremlin acknowledgment of North Korean soldiers' participation against Ukraine. Analysts suggest Kim may attend Russia's May 9 Victory Day celebrations in Moscow. *Read more*

US deploys B-1 bombers to Japan, placing North Korea in closer striking range

The U.S. has deployed B-1B Lancer bombers to Misawa Air Base in northern Japan, just 810 miles from Pyongyang. This marks the first such deployment to Japan, aimed at strengthening deterrence against North Korea and China amid rising regional tensions and escalating security challenges. *Read more*



Seoul launches 4th spy satellite to boost NK surveillance

South Korea launched its fourth domestically developed spy satellite, enhancing its reconnaissance capabilities to monitor North Korea. The satellite, equipped with synthetic aperture radar, will improve surveillance despite weather conditions and time of day. By 2025, South Korea plans a five-satellite network for real-time monitoring and faster response to provocations. *Read more*

US flies long-range bomber for drill with South Korea, as North marks key state anniversary

The U.S. conducted a joint drill with South Korea, involving long-range bombers, as North Korea marked a key state anniversary. The exercise aimed to strengthen deterrence against North Korea's provocations and enhance security cooperation. The display of military strength comes amid rising tensions on the Korean Peninsula. *Read more*

Audit Reveals South Korea Falsified 2018 DMZ Guard Post Inspections to Maintain Inter-Korean Pact Timeline

South Korea's military manipulated inspection findings in 2018 to falsely declare North Korean guard posts dismantled under a key peace accord, the Board of Audit and Inspection revealed. Despite underground structures remaining intact, reports were altered to preserve diplomatic momentum. Prosecutors are now investigating six former top defense officials. Read more

North Korea continues to pursue covert biological weapons program: US report

A U.S. State Department report claims North Korea maintains a covert biological weapons program, violating international treaties. Despite being a signatory of the Biological Weapons Convention, Pyongyang is suspected of producing pathogens, toxins, and using unconventional delivery methods. The U.S. continues monitoring this breach of international commitments. <u>Read more</u>

Korea Trade Insurance Corp. opens Washington office

South Korea's Trade Insurance Corp. (K-SURE) has opened its first U.S. office in Washington, D.C., aiming to support Korean exporters and strengthen economic ties with the U.S. The office will provide financial services and risk management, particularly benefiting sectors like semiconductors and electric vehicles. *Read more*

South Korea Joins NATO's Science & Technology Enhanced Partnership

On March 1, 2025, South Korea became an S&T Enhanced Partner of NATO, gaining access to collaborative research in areas like cybersecurity, medicine, and propulsion. Joining alongside Switzerland and Ukraine, South Korea will now contribute to NATO's strategic scientific board and global security innovation network. Read more

World-OKTA Faces Backlash Over Event in Wildfire-Hit Andong

The World Federation of Overseas Korean Traders Association (World-OKTA) is facing criticism for holding its leaders' convention in Andong, recently devastated by wildfires. Critics cite insensitivity and possible election law violations after receiving government subsidies. World-OKTA plans to proceed with export consultations and fundraising for displaced residents during the event. Read more

Trump's 145% tariff on Chinese batteries opens door for Korean rivals

The U.S.'s new 145% tariff on Chinese energy storage batteries boosts South Korean battery firms, reducing China's price advantage. LG Energy Solution, Samsung SDI, and SK On are adapting with LFP battery production for the U.S. market, capitalizing on existing infrastructure and local manufacturing to gain market share. New alliances: Hyundai, Posco team up on steel, batteries to tackle US tariffs

Hyundai Motor and Posco Group have formed a strategic alliance in the U.S. to counter high tariffs and secure EV battery materials. Posco may invest in Hyundai's Louisiana steel plant, while both aim to establish a robust U.S. supply chain. The move signals a major shift in their rivalry. <u>Read more</u>

Unprecedented Heat Drives Dangerous Wildfires in South Korea and Japan

From March 21-26, 2025, unseasonably high temperatures fueled dangerous wildfires across South Korea and Japan. Human-caused climate change amplified the heat, increasing fire risks in drought-affected areas. With temperatures up to 10°C above average, experts warn that these extreme heat events are now more likely due to climate change. *Read more*
